Friendly celebrations

World Friendship Day is celebrated on the first Sunday of August in India, on August 5th in Canada and on July 20th in Argentina. It was introduced to promote fellowship amongst all people, irrespective of race, colour or religion.

Originally proposed by Joyce Hall, the founder of the very popular Hallmark cards in 1919, it took quite a long time before Friendship Day captured people’s imagination. At first, in the 1920s, the idea of celebrating one’s friendships by sending each other cards was regarded by consumers as a cynical marketing strategy invented to promote greeting cards. By the 1940s, the number of Friendship Day cards available in the US had shrunk and, as a result, the holiday was largely forgotten. There is no evidence for its continuation in Europe either. However, the tradition has been doing well in Asia, where several countries have adopted the custom of dedicating a day to friends and exchanging Friendship Day presents like flowers, cards and wristbands.

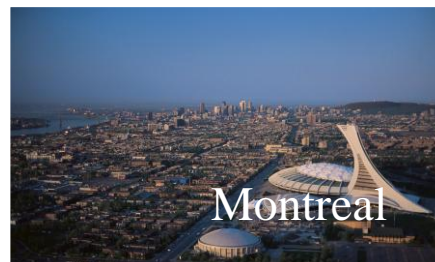
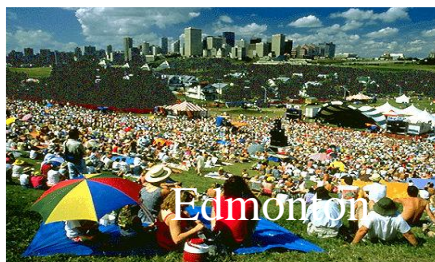

1. It is the most popular city in Canada, the provincial capital of Ontario. It is an international centre of business, finance, arts, and culture, and widely recognized as one of the most multicultural and cosmopolitan cities in the world. It's famous for the Zoo (home to over 5,000 animals representing over 460 distinct species), Allen Lambert Galleria, the Distillery District, the Royal Alexandra Theatre, the CN Tower (which is a major tourist attraction), the Canadian National Exhibition, the Hockey Hall of Fame and so on.
2. It is the 2nd-most populous in Canada. Originally called *Ville-Marie*, or "City of Mary," it is named after Mount Royal, the triple-peaked hill in the heart of the city. The city is on the Island of Montreal, which took its name from the same source as the city, and a few much smaller peripheral islands.
3. It is the capital city of Canada. It's famous for Elgin Street, the *Maman* sculpture by Louise Bourgeois, the Canadian Tire Centre, the National Hockey League.
4. It is a coastal seaport city on the mainland of British Columbia, Canada, and the most popular city in the province.
5. It is on the North Saskatchewan River and its nickname "Canada's Festival City" . It's famous for several large festivals each year : the Works Art & Design Festival, The International Street Performer's Festival , K-Days, Folk Music Festival and the International Film Festival .
